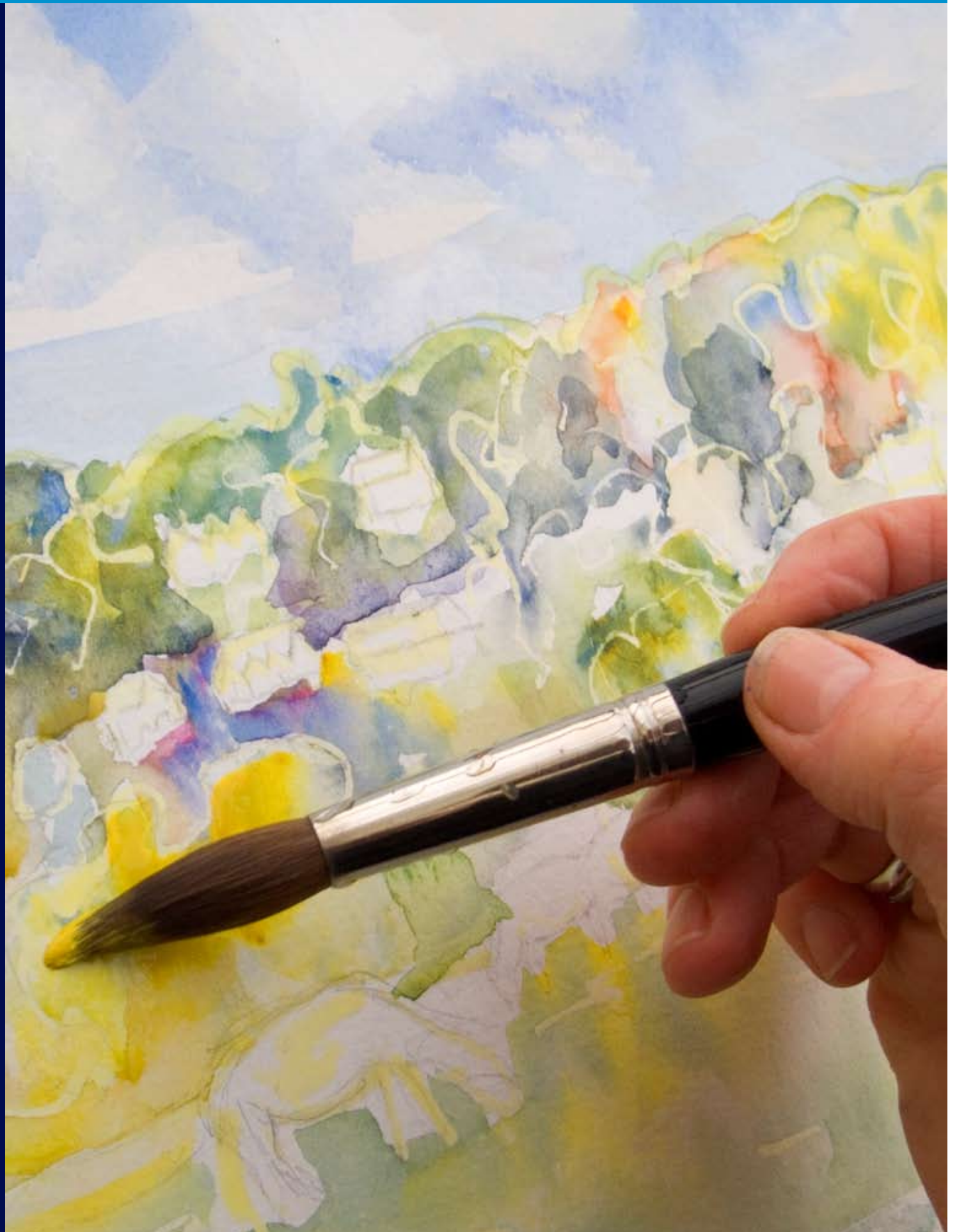

**From Mechanicsburg & Camp Hill:** Follow Trindle Road (Rt 641 West, which is Main Street in Mechanicsburg) to 1/4 mile past the Rt 174 intersection, turn right onto Artcraft Drive to The Art Center barn.

**From Carlisle:** Follow Rt 641 East to 1/2 mile past Locust Point Road. Turn left onto Artcraft Drive to The Art Center barn.

**From Route 83:** Take Rt 83 to Rt 581 West toward Camp Hill. See directions below.

**From Rt 581 West:** Take Mechanicsburg/Rt 641 Exit, turning right at the end of the ramp and right again at Trindle Road (Rt 641 W). Continue west, through Mechanicsburg, to 1/4 mile past the Rt 174 intersection. Turn right onto Artcraft Drive to the Art Center barn.

**Just for Laughs**

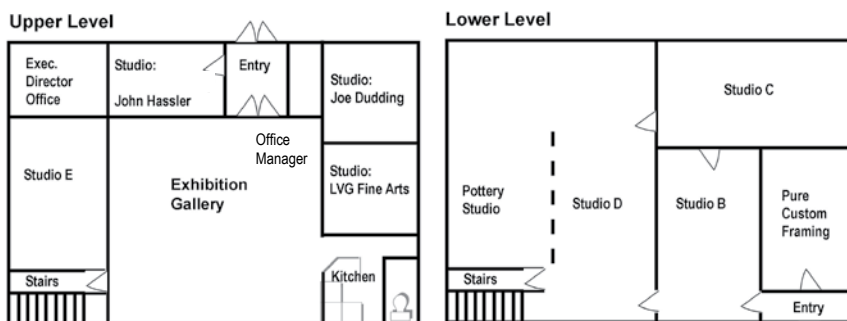
An artist asked the gallery owner if there had been any interest in his paintings on display at that time.

In this workshop, you will learn the basic workings of a glass torch. We will start by heating glass to understand how it moves and what can be done with it. We will also examine the application of precious metal coloring using gold and silver. Utilizing the technique learned, we will create various objects such as Marbles, Pendants, and Paper Weights. Techniques for creating blown objects will be discussed.

### 9202 Beginning Pysanky (Ukrainian Easter Eggs)

Pysanky literally means "the egg that has been written on". The process involves applying melted wax to the eggs and then dyeing them, which through several applications will yield an intricate pattern of color on the shells. The process is similar to the batik process used in the South Pacific. It has been a staple of the Eastern Orthodox Easter celebration for hundreds of years.

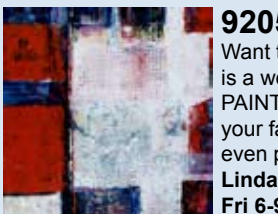

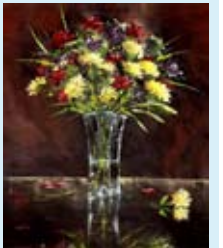

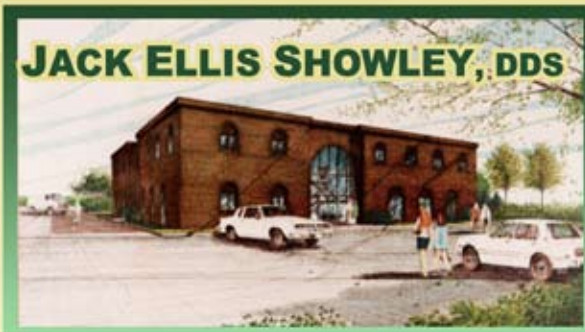
